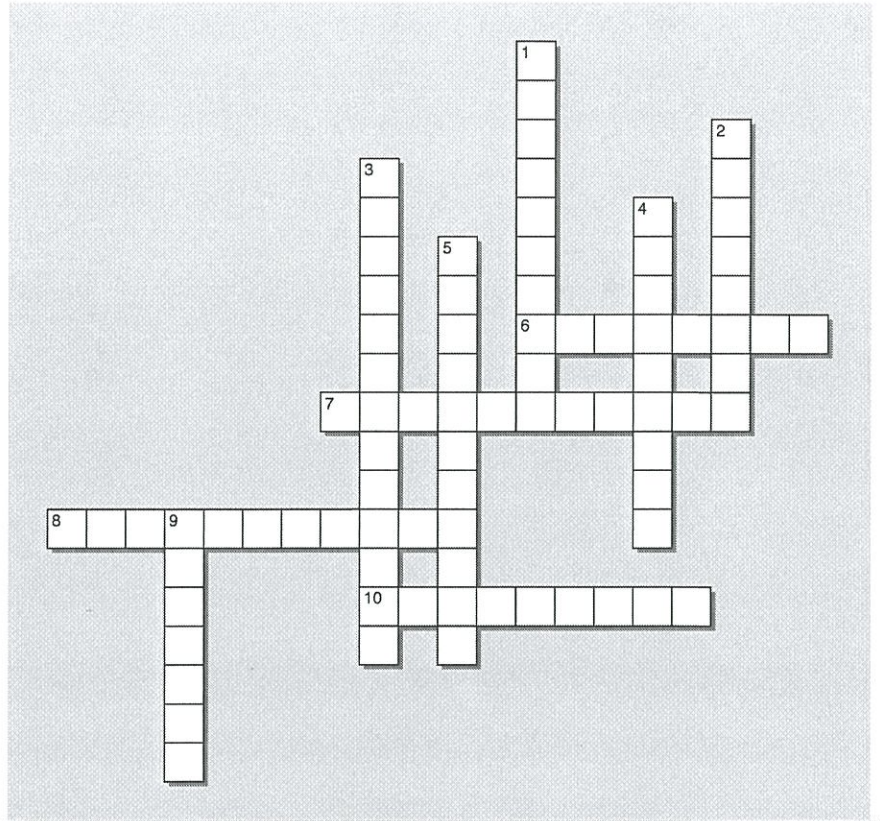

Definition: record events in a factual and detailed way
Synonyms: record, document
3. chronological [Adjective]
Sentence: I listed the dates in chronological order.
Definition: arranged by order in time or by date
Antonyms: random, intermittent
Synonyms: temporal, sequential, consecutive
4. chronometer [Noun]
Sentence: I can navigate by checking the chronometer.
Definition: A timepiece with a special mechanism for ensuring and adjusting its accuracy.
5. synchronize [Verb]
Sentence: Let's synchronize schedules so they match.
Definition: to make things coordinate with each other
Antonyms: mismatch, disorder
Synonyms: coordinate, harmonize
6. planetarium [Noun]
Sentence: A planetarium projects stars inside its dome.
Definition: building projecting the heavens inside a dome
7. aquarium [Noun]
Sentence: The glass aquarium held over one hundred fish.

Root

chronic – *adj.* continuing or occurring again and again for a long time; happening or existing frequently or most of the time. *His arthritis causes chronic pain.*

chronicle – *n.* a description of events in the order they happened. *Students taking American History must read a chronicle of the Revolutionary War.*

chronological – *adj.* arranged in the order that things happened or came to be; using time as a measurement. *The lawyer made a chronological list of events that occurred leading up to the accident.*

chronometer – *n.* a watch or clock that measures time precisely. *The scientist measured elapsed time with a chronometer.*

synchronize – *v.* to cause things to agree in time or to make things happen at the same time and speed. *The dancers worked hard to synchronize their movements with the music.*

emporium – *n.* a large retail store, especially one selling a great variety of articles. *Settlers came from miles away to buy and sell at the emporium.*

assessment – *n.* the act of making a judgment about something; the result of an evaluation. *After her careful assessment of my outfit for the first day of school, Mom dropped me off.*

amendment – *n.* a change in the words or meaning of a law or document (such as a constitution); a change made by correction, addition, or deletion. *Mrs. Jones made a few amendments to the article I wrote for the school paper.*
